In the aviation sector, safety remains a top priority, with specialized roles such as Safety Managers, Safety Inspectors, and Aviation Safety Officers dedicated to maintaining safety standards. For logistics management, prominent roles include Logistics Managers, Logistics Supervisors, and Supply Chain Executives.

The aviation sector is also experiencing increasing demand for mid-career roles like Transportation Managers, Supply Chain Managers, Logistics Engineers, and Supply Chain Analysts.
